We are grateful to almighty God for the blessing of a new deacon. Beginning with the World Day of Prayer for Creation on September 1 to October 4, the feast of Saint Francis of Assisi, we also acknowledge this month has been designated by Pope Francis as the Season of Creation. As part of the Vicar of the Founder lecture series, Dr. Hilda Koster, Associate Professor of Ecological Theology at Regis-St. Michael's Faculty of Theology in the University of Toronto will be offering a presentation on Sunday, October 1 at St. Francis Xavier University entitled *Hope in a time of Climate Emergency: Lessons from Laudato Si*'

Holy Guardian Angels Parish in L'Ardoise continues celebrating its 200th Anniversary on Sunday, September 3 with Mass <u>at 3 p.m.</u>

St. Mary's Polish Parish is celebrating its 110th Anniversary on Sunday, September 10 with a special Mass followed by gathering at the Polish Village Hall.

Our new Atlantic Dioceses' Diaconate Formation Program (ADDFP) will be meeting on September 15 to 17 at Villa Madonna, in Saint John, NB. We are beginning a combined four-year diaconate preparation program along with the Archdiocese of Halifax – Yarmouth, the Diocese of Saint John and the Diocese of Grand Falls. Two candidates from our diocese were accepted into this program.

In September of 2021, our Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops agreed to establish a \$30 million National Reconciliation Fund to support and advance healing and reconciliation initiatives for Indigenous People. Every diocese including the Diocese of Antigonish has committed to raising revenue for this fund over a five-year period. Once again this year, on the

weekend of <u>September 30</u> / <u>October 1</u>, we will have our annual collection. Appropriately these dates correspond to National Day of Truth and Reconciliation <u>on September 30</u> and Treaty Day <u>on October 1</u>. Posters and envelopes will be ready for distribution by the end of this month.
